It was extremely heartwarming to see the computer systems surrounded by children who either had no or very limited access to computers.

History:

Noor Foundation was formed by my father Abdul Rehman and my late uncle Abdullah in Karachi, Pakistan in 1996. The primary goal of the foundation is to help the poor children of Pakistan in the field of education and healthcare.

Inspired by the work of my father and deceased uncle, Noor Foundation Inc was incorporated in Aurora, IL in 2000. Noor Foundation received the "Not for Profit" 501(c) status in 2002. Since then, the foundation has sponsored hundreds of students and several schools in Pakistan.

My father, who with the help of a few others, is responsible for the distribution of funds to the poor students. They constantly visit the schools and meet with school administrators and parents to review the curriculum and analyze the needs of the students and schools, before making recommendations for the distribution of funds.

We usually pick up either half or all of the tuition of poor school-going children. They are requested to fill out an extensive application form requiring details of their academic performance, the size and condition of their family, and their livelihood. A proper review of the application is made before the award recommendation.

We have concluded that the neediest are the students are those from blue-collar families, who are in the professions of cooking, cleaning, driving, security, gardening etc. They typically have large families and are often paid less than Rs 4000/= per month (Less than \$50/=).

Government schools are almost free, but lack the discipline and staff needed to achieve the desired success of a student. Average private school fees range from Rs 300-500. We decided to support this particular segment of the society for primary education, as boys of secondary education age are often put to work earning a livelihood for the family.

NFI served the poorest of the poor of society, who were often dependent on earnings through daily employment.
